We will offer a 4-week, half-day program for approximately 80 students in grades 1-8, and will include a variety of enrichment experiences from science and math to fine arts and fitness. The camp will continue to serve a critical role in stimulating the local economy through the high-school teen employment opportunity as camp counselors. While the experience will be different compared to past years, we look forward to serving the community this summer, and hope you consider joining us too!

- Student Instruction Hours: 9:00am to 12:30pm
 - Teachers are expected to be at the Quinn Center from 8:30am - 1:00pm

Roles and Responsibilities

- Develops and implements lessons focused on academic, fine arts and social emotional learning enrichment activities for grade-specific students.
- Prepares classroom materials, evaluates student progress, and provides feedback to directors about student needs.
- Will attend a teacher orientation prior to the start of the summer program.

Required skills

- Computer literacy
- Ability to maintain accurate records
- Comfortable working with people of all ages and from diverse backgrounds
- Ability to organize and keep confidentiality
- Good listening skills
- Flexibility and creativity
- Associates degree or higher preferred

Required training and background checks (will be included in teacher orientation)

- All Archdiocese of Chicago employee requirements including, but not limited to: Virtus Training, Criminal Background Check, Child Abuse and Neglect Background check, Mandated Reporter Training

Compensation: \$16 per hour (Paid in one lump-sum at the end of the summer program)
